APPLICATION MATERIALS

Application

Some partners collect and submit their students' application details using the agent portal. Email **brett.armstrong@aut.ac.nz** with any questions relating to the agent portal.

Supporting documents required to be submitted/uploaded with the Study Abroad application

- Evidence of citizenship current passport details or birth certificate (and an official English translation if applicable)
- Current official academic transcripts with explanation of the grading system (both sides of transcript) (and an official English translation if applicable)
- c. Official academic transcripts of completed undergraduate studies (for postgraduate study only)
- d. English language tests (IELTS/TOEFL or equivalent) (as applicable)
- e. 1x passport sized photo of good quality (must be .jpg/.jpeg format)
- f. Other relevant supporting documentation

Language requirements for AUT Study Abroad

Students must meet these requirements before applying:

- Completed at least one year of full-time study at a recognised university (or two years for the study-internship option).
- A better than average academic record, especially in the most recent year of study (or have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale for the study-internship option)
- English language requirements (if English is not the student's first language):
 - An IELTS (Academic) score of 6.0 overall with all bands 5.5 or higher for undergraduate programmes
 - An IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 overall with all bands 6.0 or higher for postgraduate programmes
 - Note that some specialised study programmes may have a higher English language requirement

*Level 6, 7 and 8 courses may have prerequisites. If the student has done similar courses, prerequisites may be waived.

Course search and selection

Students can browse the Study Abroad course options: Study Options

For course descriptors and timetables: Search for a specific course to see when (semester/times/streams) it is being offered.

If no timetable is showing, the course has not yet been confirmed or is not available.

Once courses are chosen and the timetable is aligned, students can **nominate their choices**

Adding/dropping or changing courses

The course add/drop period ends at the conclusion of the second week of lectures.

ACCOMMODATION AT AUT

Study Abroad students are guaranteed* accommodation at AUT's on-campus accommodation.

Students must apply for AUT accommodation by a certain date in order to reserve a room.

Semester 1, 2024

- 1 August 2023 Application portal opens
- 1 October 2023 Email agents for projected numbers
- 13 October 2023 Confirmation of student numbers
- 30 November 2023 Accommodation applications from Study Abroad due
- 2 weeks after arrival Invoices sent

Most classes take place at the AUT City Campus. WSA and Mayoral Drive are on the borders of the City Campus.

*There will be a deadline to reserve a room. This date will be given to students during the application process. Students will be able to still apply after the deadline, but accommodation will not be guaranteed at that point.

INSURANCE AND STUDENT VISA

Insurance

All Study Abroad students must have medical and travel insurance, as mandated by New Zealand government regulations. Additional information will be provided upon acceptance of the students' applications. Read about AUT's insurance regulations.

New Zealand student visa

Study Abroad students must apply for their New Zealand student visa online via the **Immigration New Zealand website**.

AUT International staff can't assist with visa applications or contact New Zealand Immigration (INZ) on behalf of students. Each student is responsible for managing their own application process independently.

On average, we (INZ) process student visa applications in 18 weekdays. 90% of applications are processed within 66 weekdays.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Student support at the Student Hub

The AUT Student Hub can help with most student questions. There is a physical location on each campus. They can also be reached **online**.

Students can also find additional international student support.

Campus medical and mental health support

AUT's Student Medical Centre has three clinics, located on each campus, offering free to low-cost healthcare, in-person or virtual, to current AUT students.

Explore their services, including mental health support.

Students can enrol at the health centre as soon as they arrive in Auckland and have proof of their local address.

Students who need to take prescription drugs should check with the medical centre about obtaining prescriptions while in New Zealand.

IT HELP

Arion

AUT students can use Arion to:

- View information about courses and programmes
- Check and pay invoices including making fee payments
- View academic results and confirm your application
- Check AUT correspondence
- Update personal details

To access this information, students can log into Arion and then click on the 'Academic Details' menu.

Logging in and out of Arion

When students apply to AUT, a student ID number and password will be provided to each student via email. The Offer of Place letter will display the student's ID number.

They can visit **https://arion.aut.ac.nz** and use these details to log in.

They should go to the 'Options' menu to log out.

Canvas

Canvas is AUT's web-based learning environment where students can access course materials while they are studying at AUT, including lecture slides, course readings, assessments, grades and their academic team all in one place.

Once students have enrolled into their courses for the semester, all course material will be available in Canvas – either through their web browser or the Canvas Student App.

Logging into Canvas

- The student's login name and password for Canvas will be the same as the login they use for My AUT and to access AUT computers
- The default password is the student's day and month of birth in this format (ddmmm).
 Example: O3aug if born on August 3rd.
- Students can reset their password if they have forgotten it



STUDENT ACTIVITIES

All students are encouraged to add the AUT App to their phone.

We encourage our incoming Study Abroad students to attend campus Orientation. Orientation is an exciting time on campus and a great start to the student journey. It will help prepare students for life and study at AUT, and make sure they are ready when classes start.

MY eQuals

Obtaining grades with My eQuals

My eQuals is a secure online academic document verification platform that serves more than 50 education providers across New Zealand and Australia including all the major universities.

Students can use their My eQuals account to share academic results online.

They choose who to share their documents with, and for how long.

Signing up to My eQuals

After students finish their semester, and the faculty confirms grades, they will receive an email from My eQuals containing a link to register their My eQuals account.

The email will be sent to the email address a student provided in their Arion account – they should log in to check the email address stored in their Arion account is still valid.
